



Dear Community Foundation Friends and Patrons:

In May 2008, the Kansas Association of Community Foundations commissioned a transfer of wealth study for Kansas. Results from that study, which was conducted by the Center for Economic Development and Business Research at Wichita State University, project that more than \$66 billion is estimated to transfer from one generation to the next by the year 2020. Most will go to heirs and taxes, but a large portion will leave our communities and our state as younger generations move away. Community foundations across the state are leading an effort to ensure that a portion is preserved and invested back in our communities.

For generations people lived their entire lives close to their birthplace, and as wealth passed from one generation to the next, most stayed in the same county. This is no longer the case, and once that wealth leaves our communities, it may never return. The Board of Directors of both the Wamego Community Foundation and the Kansas Rural Communities Foundation want to encourage residents to designate a portion of their estates, 401(k) and IRA accounts, or life insurance policies to their community foundation or favorite charitable cause.

In March 2008, the KRCF and WCF partnered and jointly hired our first executive director, René Eichem; at the same time, I took on the role of president of both Foundations. This unique collaboration has allowed us to assist communities and organizations throughout the state with their philanthropic endeavors and transfer of wealth initiatives.

We had many exciting accomplishments in 2008, but the year was not without issues. Most importantly were the tumultuous financial markets that have shaken our country. The Foundations' portfolios were no different than anyone else's; however, over a longer time frame, our portfolio has performed quite well. Our Board of Directors take great pride in being stewards of the Foundations, and we believe our investment strategy is sound and will provide excellent long-term results for our donors.

With growth and the ability to serve the needs of our communities come financial requirements. We ask for your continued support by contributing to our administrative fund or other fund whose purposes are important to you, or by establishing a new fund. Perhaps you or someone you know would like to establish a high school scholarship in honor of a loved one; create a community improvement fund; start an endowment fund for the arts; or contribute real estate, insurance, stocks, or other assets through the Foundation. # History and Mission Statement

---

The initial movement to establish the Wamego Community Foundation began in early 1998 when Rosemary Crilly, then-executive director of the Wamego Chamber of Commerce, brought together several other community-minded philanthropists with the vision of establishing a community foundation. The WCF received its tax-exempt status as a 501(c)(3) nonprofit corporation from the IRS in October of that year, and the founding board members spent the following year focused on fundraising and public awareness. At the end of 2000, the Foundation had 16 funds and assets of more \$160,000 and was able to award its first grants. Since its inception, the WCF has received approximately \$1.3 million in gifts and donations and distributed back more than \$600,000 for charitable and educational purposes.

Several years later, Michael Rice, the founding president of the WCF, and Bob Cole, director of Pottawatomie County Economic Development, realized the knowledge and successes of the WCF board would benefit other rural communities in Kansas. In September 2005 they filed the articles of incorporation and in March 2006 the Kansas Rural Communities Foundation (KRCF) received its tax-exempt status. By the end of 2006, three affiliated funds had been established and total assets were \$29,000. At the end of fiscal year 2008, the KRCF managed 20 funds with assets in excess of \$1.07 million.

# Fund Types



## AFFILIATED FUNDS

Another nonprofit may affiliate or “partner” with the Foundation for mutual benefit, including negotiating greater rates of return on pooled investments, assistance with accounting and reporting, and other services that may be required. Affiliation may include the establishment of an unrestricted fund for general grant making purposes by the Affiliate or the establishment of other, named funds that may be unrestricted, field-of-interest, organization, designated, or donor-advised, by the Affiliate. Each affiliation agreement will specify the mutual goals and purposes of the Foundation and the Affiliate.

## DESIGNATED FUNDS

These funds are ideal if you want to support one or more specific organizations of your choice. Designated funds often are endowed in perpetuity with the income used to support the specified organizations on an on-going basis. The Foundation ensures that disbursements are made to the appropriate charitable agencies as specified in the establishing fund document. If an agency stops functioning as an exempt charity or ceases to exist, the Foundation Board of Directors may select an alternative charity as indicated in the fund document. Nonprofit groups can also establish this kind of fund as part of their organization’s own fundraising strategy.

## DONOR-ADVISED FUNDS



A donor-advised fund is a flexible tool for charitable giving. You can contribute to your fund when it is most convenient and then recommend gifts over time to nonprofit organizations of your choice. You select a fund name and then get to enjoy recommending grants for the organizations committed to the causes you care about. You can also involve your children and grandchildren to share in a family tradition of giving.

## FIELD OF INTEREST FUNDS

This type of fund allows you to support an area of charitable interest, defined broadly (such as education) or narrowly (such as math tutoring). You also can select a defined geographic area or a specific community to benefit from your named fund. In determining suitable grant recipients that meet the fund’s criteria, you can stay involved, appoint an advisory committee, or leave the work to the Foundation Grants and Distributions Committee.



# Fund Types



## ORGANIZATIONAL ENDOWMENT FUNDS

These are endowment funds created by other nonprofit charitable organizations to which the Foundation provides financial, investment management, and other services. The organization that creates the fund has its own Board of Directors, which makes decisions as to disbursements from the fund.

## SCHOLARSHIP FUNDS

The creation of a scholarship fund is attractive if you are interested in helping students further their education at any level. You may specify the criteria to be used in selecting recipients. For example, you may wish to support students who were involved in a certain high school activity; are studying a particular subject in college; or are attending a specific university or trade school. You may wish to name your scholarship fund in honor of a loved one.

## SPECIAL PURPOSE FUNDS

Special Purpose Funds support a particular project or community initiative. This type of fund is shorter in duration than the other types of funds. The fund comes to an end once the special purpose is fulfilled. These are not endowment funds—all principal and earnings are distributed.

## UNRESTRICTED FUNDS

Unrestricted Funds are not specifically designated for use by a particular agency, cause, or area of interest. The Foundation Board of Directors would oversee the use of your named unrestricted fund and set priorities for its use. Unrestricted funds give the Foundation the greatest latitude over the years in how to direct grants, based on the Foundation Board's assessment of changing needs.
