So much happened during 2019. Here are some of the highlights.

- Caring Neighbors, a fund focused on helping cancer patients with costs associated with treating their illness, helped their first patient in January and several more throughout the year.
- The **Kansas Agents Association** held a silent auction at their annual convention in February. Each year, the proceeds from this event are donated to a non-profit in the State of Kansas. This year they donated over \$30,000 to two non-profits.
- The **Wabaunsee County Fair Association Improvement**, a new fund this year, raised funds and renovated bathroom facilities on the Wabaunsee county fairgrounds just in time for the fair.
- The **Herington Fireworks Committee** regrouped this year and held several fundraisers focused on raising money for fireworks in 2020.
- The **Eskridge Park Fund** launched their '110 Campaign' celebrating the 110<sup>th</sup> anniversary of the historic bandstand in the park. This year they completed the Veteran's memorial in the park. Their future plans include a playground, sidewalks, lighting, picnic areas and more.
- **Scholarships** were awarded to high school graduates and non-traditional college students from several scholarship funds. Anyone can establish a scholarship fund!
- Two small towns invited everyone to join them at their annual festivals. The **DeSoto Days** Festival fund raised money to throw their annual festival 'Livin it up in a Small Town'. While the Paxico Community fund held their annual blues festival 'Keep the Blues Alive'.
